We call on all of the members of the American Baptist Churches of the USA to:

- 1. Affirm the goodness and beauty of God's creation.
- 2. Acknowledge our responsibility for stewardship of the Creator's good earth.
- 3. Learn of the environmental dangers facing the planet.
- 4. Recognize that our practices and styles of life have had an effect on the environment.
- 5. Pursue a lifestyle that is wise and responsible in light of our understanding of the problems.
- 6. Exert our influence in shaping public policy and insisting that industries, businesses, farmers and consumers relate to the environment in ways that are sensible, healthy and protective of its integrity.

7. Demonstrate concern with "the hope that is within us," as despair and apathy surround us in the world (Rom. 12:21).

8. Become involved in organizations and actions to protect and restore the environment and the people in our communities.

GUIDELINES FOR MAKING SANDWICHES

- Sandwiches should be made no earlier than 1 day prior to donation date
- ◆ Cathedral Kitchen requests we work on sanitized/clean surfaces and wear gloves
- Any type of bread is fine (wheat is even better)
- ◆ Turkey/*Beef Bologna and Cheese or Peanut Butter and Jelly (*religious or cultural preferences)
- ◆ Please do not include dressings (mustard, mayo, tomatoes, etc.)
- ♦ No need to slice sandwich in half
- ◆ Place each sandwich into a sealed plastic baggie and label appropriately. Please separate PB&J sandwiches from turkey/bologna with cheese.
- ♦ Place all sandwiches into a large plastic or paper bag

We will continue donations to Cathedral Kitchen on the 3rd Thursday of each month. Please deliver sandwiches to the First Baptist Church of Haddonfield parking lot on Thursday, April 18, 2024 between 10:30-11:30 AM. YOUR DONATIONS ARE NEEDED!!! 
- What's Happening At The Cemetery? -

The news from the cemetery is there was one interment placed and three foundations ordered.

Still have not made contact with Reanimate or Alonso Taylor for the roof on the chapel. The certified letter that was sent to his house and business was returned in February ... never opened nor delivered. The cemetery needs this money to help pay for the new roof on the chapel, if grants are available for this purpose. I will try some other line of getting in touch with this business person.


I have been reading several books that explain why the cemetery does what it does. The book entitled "Over My Dead Body" is an interesting read starting out with a teenager cutting grass in the summer for money until he journeys around the United States. He explains how some cemeteries are placed on older properties which were not kept up. In the state of New York in 2023, an average of eight cemeteries have gone under and now are under the municipality that they are in. At the same time, more Americans are being cremated than buried. The First Baptist Cemetery of Haddonfield still favors full burial. I will try to input some of this man's thoughts about burials, He calls Forest Lawn Memorial Park in Glendale, California the "Disneyland" of graveyards. This is the final resting place for Walt Disney. So, keep reading about this man's journey with famous grave sites.

On a final note in passing, I live on a dead end with about twelve houses. We are a neighborhood that celebrates all the significant events in life with a United Nations feeling. There are two Indian families from India, a family from Honduras, another from Mexico and then there is me ... a first generation American with parents coming from Germany and Ireland. The neighborhood was shaken up by the announcement of a neighbor's 30 year old son dying while traveling to a foreign country. He was a husband of eight months and an owner of a house in South Philadelphia. His wife awoke to what she thought was a bad nightmare that he was having but then realized that he couldn't catch his breath. She did CPR and called a nurse who was traveling with them and then the paramedics but the young man was dead. Our neighborhood is collecting money for a memorial at his parent's house with either a tree or bushes. The parents will make the decision of what they want. This is my neighborhood and I am proud to live there. Old time values of being there for someone and just plain caring are not completely forgotten in this rush, rush world.

Diaconate Food Ministry: In February, 92 families, 182 adults, and 83 children were served. The urgent needs requested are Peanut Butter & Jelly, Cereal, Canned Vegetables, Canned Fruit, Pasta & Pasta Sauce, Soup, Cooking Oil, Mayonnaise, Sugar, & Coffee. All monetary donations are also appreciated. The distribution dates this month are April 15: 4:00 pm-6:00pm and April 16: 12 noon-2:00 pm, so please leave your donations in the designated box located in the Middleton Room prior to those dates. (Reminder: There are two boxes in the Middleton Room, so be sure to deposit your donations into the appropriate one for the Diaconate Food Ministry. Don't leave used clothing in the Hands & Feet and Diaconate Food Donation boxes.)

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: The Fellowship Fund received \$260.05 in February, and \$418 so far in March. In February, one member received \$340.24 for bills. The Bank Balance as of March 9th is \$1,725.67.

Practical Christianity

Lesson 5.1) Against such things there is no law, but... At the conclusion of the list of the fruit of the Spirit in Galatians 5:23b, Paul writes that "against such things there is no law." (NIV) As Christians, who are also known as disciples or followers of Christ, we are to now keep in step with the Holy Spirit since we live by God's Spirit (Galatians 5:25). But if we back up a bit to verse 24, Paul reminds us that "those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires." (NIV) So, what exactly are these "passions and desires"? They are listed even earlier in Galatians 5:19-21. When an individual grows in the fruit of the Spirit, the "acts of the flesh" decrease in that individual's life. This takes focus and dedication to God's principles in addition to lots of prayer from self and others in the body of Christ, so that we do "not become conceited, provoking and envying each other." {Read Galatians 5:19-21, 23b-25; Pray}
